IN OUR CHURCH

I wonder if any of us have ever had an experience where we have gone on a life changing journey only for something unexpected to happen; you had an unexpected set back of some kind and as such found yourself back in the same place you started. Being so disorientated and confused by this unexpected event and setback you then struggle to find a way forward. So, finding comfort in the familiar you go back to what you were doing beforehand.

This is exactly where we find the disciples during today's reading, back in their fishing boats applying their old trade, finding comfort in the familiar. So familiar in fact that once again, just like when Jesus first called the disciples, he is standing on the shoreline watching the disciples come in from a night of fishing with nothing to show for it. Mirroring the events of their first interaction, Jesus once again tells them where to drop their nets and as such they catch more fish than their boats can handle. This could be seen as starting over for the disciples.

News from Parish Council.

Volunteers Day. Sunday 22nd May is Volunteers Day. To honour all our volunteers from the church and community, Cameron has offered to cook breakfast for them. The Council gladly accepted his offer and decided to make the 9.30am service one to which we would be comfortable to invite our non-church volunteers. Cameron will develop plans for this and keep you informed as details emerge.

Holy Communion. As things return to some kind of normality, we expect a direction from the Diocese regarding a return to taking communion in both kinds (i.e. bread and wine) using the shared chalice. When that happens (sooner or later) we expect some people may be concerned about using the chalice. So, the Council has decided in addition to the chalice, individual glasses of consecrated wine will be available for those who wish to take that option. The glasses will then be rinsed in clean water which will then be poured into the garden. The glasses will then be put in the dishwasher. Please speak to one of the clergy if this proposal raises questions for you.

Work, Health and Safety. The Council is in the process of revising its WHS management plan and will continue to report on this as the review proceeds. It is important to note that WHS is everyone's responsibility. If you see anything that could pose a risk to safety (a hazard), please make a report using the Hazard/Injury report form available in the foyer.
