AN INTELLECTUAL FINDS WISDOM

Most of us know that if we don't want to keep caught or found out by others, then it can be useful to go about our business in the dark,

And I think this is why Nicodemus choose to go to Jesus at night in today's gospel passage. He was probably hoping that nobody would be able to see where he was going and find out what he was up to.

You see, not only was Nicodemus a Pharisee, a Jewish leader and teacher who knew the Mosaic law backwards and forwards and strictly followed it. He was an expert and an intellectual and he was curious about what this controversial new rabbi Jesus was saying and doing.

And so, the two teachers came to be talking to each other about matters of faith. It would be more accurate to say that one teacher was talking over the head of the other. Nicodemus was having a hard time following Jesus' lesson.

It is easy to sympathize with Nicodemus's perplexity. His questions are not unreasonable. The new life that Jesus has in mind is elusive, mysterious, and entirely God's doing. We worship a wind that blows where it will. We preach new life that is not available to us through our knowledge or accomplishment, but comes to us as the uncontrollable wind of the Spirit. All life is a mystery beyond our understanding, a gift that only God can give. The same Spirit who gave life in the first place gives life over and over again. This is the wisdom that we seek.
