Romans 3.21 - 24: Justified by faith

"But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed and is attested by the Law and the Prophets, the righteousness of God through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith."

In four short verses St Paul sets out the foundations of the good news he proclaims. Firstly, it is good news from God - God's 'righteousness' - or to put that another way, God's commitment to act justly - is the foundation. Then, it is good news for all, since all have sinned (that includes you and me!) All have sinned - but those who trust in Christ can be 'justified'. This is a metaphor from the law courts - it means to be declared 'not guilty'. Then Paul wheels out a metaphor from the slave market. 'Redemption' means to be set free from slavery. We are declared 'not guilty' and we are set free from bondage to sin. And all this is a gift, it is through God's grace, but it is a gift that is costly to God, because the price of our salvation is Christ's death for us on the cross, which Paul notes is 'effective through faith'.


