The story begins in the grey before dawn.

Mary Magdalene walks to the tomb before the sun has had a chance to rise. Her eyes are redrimmed from weeping. She isn't going there to witness a miracle. She's going because she doesn't know what else to do with her grief.

She gets to the tomb and sees the stone rolled away. And even though we've heard this story before—heard it so many times we know the next line by heart—Mary doesn't start singing alleluias. She panics.

Because when you're grieving, and something unexpected happens, it doesn't feel like good news. It feels like insult added to injury.

So she runs. Finds Peter and the other disciple. They come, look, confirm: the stone is gone, the body is missing, the linen wrappings are lying there, folded strangely like someone made their bed before leaving.

And then—they leave. Back to wherever it is they were hiding.

But Mary stays.

Of course she does.

Love stays.

And when she peers into the tomb again, this time she sees angels. Angels who ask her why she's weeping.

She says what we've all said, in one way or another: "They have taken him away, and I do not know where he is."

They. The world. The illness. The injustice. The death. They have taken him away.

And then—someone else speaks.

She doesn't recognise him at first. She thinks he's the gardener.

Then he says her name. *Mary*.

And that's all it takes. Not a sermon. Not a miracle. Just her name.

That's how resurrection comes. Not as a concept, but as a call.

Mary turns. Breath catches. *Rabbouni!*" she cries. *Teacher!* And just like that, the grave loses its grip.

But Jesus doesn't let her grip tightly to him either. "Do not cling to me," he says.

Because resurrection is not about going back to how things were. It's about going forward into something new. So Mary becomes the first preacher. The first apostle. The first witness. "I have seen the Lord," she says.

And that one sentence changes everything.
