#### TOUGH WORDS ABOUT BAD BEHAVIOUR

The words of Jesus in Matthew 5.21-37 challenge human hypocrisy and call for real integrity in the way we live – and they are as relevant today as they were in the time of Jesus. We can understand easily enough the injunctions about anger and lust - anyone with half a brain recognises that to nurture angry or lustful thoughts will likely lead to actions that harm people and even destroy lives. Bad behaviour, Jesus warns us, includes bad thinking. But what about his words on divorce? Here some background is necessary if we're to grasp what Jesus means.

In Jewish society at that time there were two schools of thought about divorce. One school took a rigorous view of the sanctity of marriage and permitted divorce only where the woman had been unfaithful. The other school permitted a man to divorce his wife for just about any offence (including burning his supper!) – a view which demeaned women and marriage and was wide open to abuse. It is this egregious thinking and consequent mistreatment of women that Jesus is criticising. A woman cast aside like this usually had no option but to find another man (or men) to support her and thus she may have been regarded as an adulterer – along with her new partner.

Lenten Studies at St Luke's: This year as part of our observation of Lent we will use the study guide 'I Thirst' - six reflections on the meaning of the cross written by the Most Rev'd Stephen Cottrell (now Archbishop of York). We will be encouraging church members to come together to reflect and pray using this resource and so have ordered 10 printed copies of 'I Thirst' at \$18.00 each, but the book is also available in electronic form from various sources (Kindle etc) for about \$13. If you would like a printed copy please add your name to the list on the table at the back of the church.

**Acknowledgement of Country:** Parish Council discussed the way this acknowledgement is used at our 9.30am service. The consensus was that we ought to continue to acknowledge traditional custodians but to seek to improve how we do it. In light of this the Executive resolved that, in both Sunday services, beginning on Sunday 19th February, we will trial a more succinct statement to be used at the time of 'The Peace' (in the Second Order Service). We will utilise the Prayer Book's alternative greeting 'Christ has reconciled us to God in one body through the cross,' and pick up the theme of reconciliation in our acknowledgement of the traditional custodians.

**Our Bible Study** is no longer in recess. We will recommence on Monday, 13<sup>th</sup> February, at 10am for prayer and discussion with a view to commencing Lenten studies on Monday, 20<sup>th</sup> February. Everyone is welcome.
