Keeping our eyes on the prize

In today's Gospel reading from Luke the NIV tells us that Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem, Jesus knew that he had one task, one mission for the kingdom of God that must be fulfilled and that his time was drawing near he was not going to be distracted along the way. Today's reading is a difficult one, it's confrontational and doesn't leave us much wiggle room, it strongly holds us to account and asks us if we too have our eye on the prize. Are we living our lives resolutely setting out toward the kingdom of God or are we constantly distracted, looking back at our old lives, fussing about the chores and commitments that we need to get done each day, or worry about whether people accept us as James and John were? We're looking toward the kingdom of God, or we are not. We're either responding to the call of life or we're not. We're either open to the coming future or we're not. Jesus is calling us into question and that is rarely fun or comfortable. He is calling into question the direction of our lives, the values that we claim to hold and how we are living and embodying those values. The late Billy Graham would pose this question a different way, he would ask: If you were arrested and taken before a judge for the crime of being a disciple of Christ would there be enough evidence to convict you?
