“**The Quickest Warmth Project** unfortunately cannot take any donations until about mid-February. Donations of blankets, quilts and sheets were being taken to Westworks for storage but they are overwhelmed by deliveries of loads of PPE for Anglicare staff working face-to-face with clients, and also making deliveries for a large number of refugees. So they cannot collect from Prue O'Donovan's house and like all of us, she has run out of storage space. However, donations of kitchen and cleaning items can still be received and stored downstairs. at St Luke's.”

Foodbank SA. Something exciting happened at St Luke's this week when on Wednesday morning we hosted, for the first time, a mobile Foodbank Van. The truck rolled in around 9.30 and those of us present were impressed by the organization of the volunteers – the operation is completely self sufficient. This new connection with Foodbank SA is an initiative of our Mission Action Plan, as we have observed the need of our local community when, through the Op Shop, we have been asked for food and other assistance. Foodbank provides food assistance to one million people per month across Australia.

Some statistics are quite disturbing concerning “Food Security” in Australia - 1 in 6 adults did not have enough food to eat last year; 1.6 million children went hungry last year; 2 people out of 5 seeking food assistance do not get enough food. Although there were not many customers on Wednesday morning, Sereena, the Foodbank SA Co-ordinator is convinced that St. Luke's will become a very busy hub. Foodbank will be in attendance every other Wednesday – but not Wed 26 Jan as it is a public holiday. There will be more information concerning this in the coming months.
