#### **Matthew 22.15-33: Two Dishonest Questions**

"Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" The question is put to Jesus by the Pharisees.

It's dishonest because it's designed to trap Jesus rather than to elicit information. If Jesus affirms paying the tax, he risks alienating those who hope he's the Messiah who will overthrow the Romans. If he rejects paying the tax he could be charged with sedition. Jesus sidesteps a direct response and, at the same time, makes an important point: That which pertains to the emperor is to be given to the emperor and that which pertains to God is to be given to God. The coin for the tax bears the image of Caesar but human beings bear the image of God. That said, Jesus basically affirms that it is lawful to pay the tax, and it's likely that his answer did alienate some of his more radical followers.

The second question comes from the Sadducees – a group largely drawn from the ruling class in Jerusalem. They come to Jesus with a sneering question about the resurrection. The orthodox Jewish belief in the resurrection, with its implications of judgement, wasn't congenial for them because it challenged the ethics of their use of wealth and power. In answering Jesus affirms the truth of the resurrection and makes a devastating comment on the worldview of the Sadducees. "You are wrong," he tells them, "For you know neither the scriptures not the power of God."

Both questions are dishonest because they are insincere. We should welcome sincere questions about faith but recognise that some people will ask questions to try to justify their own position.

Church members should be aware that this discussion does not and will not relate to the Referendum on the Voice (regardless of its outcome). It is simply a discussion which will seek to discern the best ways in which we, as a Parish, can acknowledge the history and culture of aboriginal people and promote understanding and respect. Other ideas that have been proposed include placing a plaque in the foyer acknowledging the traditional custodians and/or the use of indigenous art and music. You may like respectfully to make your views known to Parish Councillors.
