Favourite Psalms (3) - Psalm 51: King David's Confession

In the service of Morning Prayer we confess together, *‘We have followed our own ways and the devices and desires of hearts, we have broken your holy laws . . . ‘* In other words, like David in Psalm 51, we know God's commandments and yet sometimes we rebel against them. Too often, also, we try to rationalise our behaviour. As someone has put it, we tell ourselves rational lies – and when we do this the danger is that we give ourselves a way to avoid being honest before God. Psalm 51 reminds us that the way back to God, the way to overcome the alienation that our rebellion creates, is not to try to rationalise our behaviour, or worse, to justify it, but simply to place our trust in God's love and faithfulness and come before God honestly, for that way grace and restoration are to be found.

Resuming Holy Communion. With the resumption of sharing both bread and wine at Holy Communion, the Parish Council has decided that, as with the choice whether or not to wear a mask, so the choice whether or not to use the traditional shared cup, should rest with the individual parishioner. Your decision will depend on your personal risk profile and your assessment of the risk in using the shared cup. As an alternative to the shared cup we are also providing for the wine of Communion to be taken in individual glasses. As a third alternative, if you wish to, you can continue to receive Communion in one kind only – that is, simply to take the bread of Communion and then leave the Communion rail.

Please come forward for Communion in the normal way. The celebrant will bring the bread to you and will be followed by one of the lay assistants with the tray of individual glasses. If you wish to use that option please take a glass and drink the wine as the words of administration are said. When you leave the communion rail please turn to your right or left, depending on which side of the church you’re on, and place the used glass in the basket placed for that purpose. If you wish to use the shared cup please refuse the individual glass and wait until the second lay assistant comes to you with the chalice. The used glasses will be rinsed in a clean bucket of clean water and then washed using hot soapy water. Any wine remaining in the shared cup or in the individual glasses, will be poured onto the garden – which is an accepted practice.
