This Sunday, we continue our Easter journey with readings rich in promise, presence, and peace.

In the Gospel reading from John 14 Jesus continues his farewell message to his disciples not a goodbye marked by absence, but a loving preparation for his ongoing presence through the Holy Spirit.

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you," he says. It is a peace that sustains us, anchors us, and makes a home in us.

In Acts 16, we hear how that peace takes root in a life. Lydia, a worshiper of God, hears the g ood news from Paul and is baptized along with her whole household.

Her story reminds us that faith is not a private possession but a gift meant to be shared, extending outward into family and community. The Spirit moves in open hearts and ordinary places.

And in Revelation, we are given a vision of the radiant future God is preparing—

a city filled with light, where God's presence needs no temple, and healing flows like a river. There, the name of God is written on every forehead, a mark of love and belonging that begins even now.

Today, we draw these threads together. It invites us to recognise that we live in the alreadyand-not-yet of God's kingdom.
