We have two ways of thinking about the saints, and it turns out that neither one of them is very helpful. We think of “Saints” with a capital “S”: St. Peter, St. Teresa of Avila, St. Augustine, the named heroes of the faith who made their mark in the world and left a legacy of holiness that outlasted their lifetimes. And then we think of “saints” with a lowercase “s,” and here we usually mean someone of heroically long-suffering patience or rigidly upright moral conduct. Either concept is intimidatingly inaccessible to us regular folks, so today we’ll try and look at what it means to be an ordinary Saint.

Family Room Service – today at 4.30pm at St Luke's

- Has received advice from Bishop Denise and the Archbishop regarding the parish amalgamation and the St Luke's nomination process which is that a decision regarding the amalgamation has to be made first, then the nomination process can be undertaken either for the new parish or for St Luke's.
- Will make a formal request through Bishop Denise that a financial health check of each parish be completed by Diocesan Office.
- Is in the process of developing for a draft budget for an amalgamated parish.
- Is working to clarify the options for amalgamation available to us and will hopefully be able to report on this by 20 November.
- **Recommends:** That the JWP continues to meet to finalise the items reported on and continue to work on other items in accordance with its Terms of Reference.

Ordination of the Rev'd Cameron Burr and Mr Samuel Yengi

The Archbishop intends to ordain Cameron to the priesthood, with Samuel to be made Deacon at a Service of Ordination to be held at St Peter's Cathedral on Saturday 26th November commencing at 10am. We have not been advised of any ticketing requirements. There should be ample seating for all who wish to attend (though the same can't be said about parking – please check for any event parking restrictions).

The following day (Advent Sunday) will be Cameron's final Sunday with us before his move to the Parish of Gawler. To enable everyone to farewell Cameron **we will have a combined service at 9am** (at which Cameron will celebrate Holy Communion) followed by a special 'farewell' morning tea.
