Today the Church celebrates **Christ the King**, the final Sunday of the Christian year, when we lift our eyes from the troubles of the world and remember who truly reigns. It is a bold statement, especially in times like these. We look around and see a world that feels unsettled and unpredictable: wars and rumours of wars, rising political tensions, deep social divisions, conversations filled with anger rather than understanding. Many of us carry our own private griefs and anxieties as well—losses that weigh heavily, worries that keep us awake at night.

It can feel as though the world is spinning without a centre.

And so Christ the King Sunday asks us an important question: **What kind of king do we believe in?** Not a king who conquers by force, nor one who silences every conflict or fixes every earthly problem, but the King revealed on the cross—the King whose crown is made of thorns, whose sceptre is mercy, whose throne is the place where he pours out his life for the world. His kingdom does not advance through domination, but through forgiveness, compassion, and self-giving love.

The readings today help us see this clearly. Jeremiah speaks of a shepherd-king who gathers rather than scatters, who brings justice not through punishment but through restored relationships. Paul gives us a sweeping vision of Christ who holds all things together—even the parts of our world and our lives that seem to be falling apart. And in Luke, we see the kingdom revealed in its deepest truth: a king who offers paradise to a dying thief, even as he himself hangs on the cross.

Today we proclaim that **Christ is King**—not because the world is tidy or peaceful, but because his love is the one thing strong enough to hold us, heal us, and lead us into hope.
