## IN OUR CHURCH

### **Why Pentecost?**

In Acts 1.4 St Luke (the author of Acts) records that the risen Lord Jesus, shortly before his ascension, instructed his disciples to remain in Jerusalem and 'wait for the gift my Father has promised . . . for in a few days you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Our reading today from Acts 2 tells of the fulfilment of this promise on the day of Pentecost. But why did the disciples have to wait for Pentecost? The answer lies in a sequence of promise and fulfilment going back to the Jewish feast of Passover. Passover celebrated the liberation of the people of Israel from slavery in Egypt. It was held on the day which we now celebrate as Good Friday. Jesus died as our Passover lamb to liberate us from bondage to sin and death (1 Cor 5.7). The Feast of First Fruits, held two days after Passover (ie our Easter Day), celebrated the first indications of the new season's harvest. St Paul speaks of the resurrection of Jesus as the 'first fruits' of God's salvation (1 Cor 15.23). Pentecost comes 50 days (Greek=*pentecostes*) after First Fruits and originally celebrated the beginnings of the full harvest – and thus the fullness of God's blessing to Israel. The disciples are instructed to wait for Pentecost because the coming of the Holy Spirit on the church on that day signifies the fullness of God's blessing for the Church in the gift of the Holy Spirit.
