The Way of the King: A Reflection for Palm Sunday

Luke 19:28-44 | Isaiah 50:4-9 | Philippians 2:5-11

As Jesus rode into Jerusalem, the crowd welcomed Him with joy, waving palm branches and shouting, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" But behind this celebration lies a deeper truth: Jesus, our King, comes not in worldly power but in humility, obedience, and peace.

Philippians 2 reminds us that Christ, though divine, "humbled himself" and became obedient—even to death on a cross. His triumph was not in might, but in surrender. He entered the city on a donkey, not a warhorse—choosing servanthood over dominance.

Isaiah 50 paints the picture of a servant who listens closely to God and remains faithful in suffering. Jesus embodies this servant's heart. He listens. He obeys. He suffers with grace. And He teaches us to do the same.

Then, as Jesus draws near to Jerusalem, He weeps. Not in defeat, but in compassion. "If you had only known the things that make for peace..." (Luke 19:42). His tears reveal the loving heart of a King who longs for us to turn to God.

As we enter Holy Week, may we walk with Christ in this way of humility. May we learn to listen, to obey, and to weep with Him—for our world, for our cities, and for our own hearts. Let us welcome the King who brings true peace.
