Matthew 5:38-48: Love your enemies!

In Matthew 5:17-18 Jesus told his disciples, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them." In previous weeks we have been looking at a number of examples in which Jesus expands on what this statement means and how it should reshape the thinking and behaviour of his followers. Today, we consider the last two examples, where Jesus considers personal retaliation and love.

As before, Jesus contrasts the traditional understanding of these issues with the Godly intention of the Law. Jesus sets a high standard for his followers, leading to the idea of a Christian counter-culture. In fact, the standard that Jesus sets seems beyond our reach, and yet there are real-world examples which seem to achieve this standard. They are quite breath-taking but demonstrate that such responses are possible.

Lenten Studies at St Luke's: This year as part of our observation of Lent we will use the study guide 'I Thirst' - six reflections on the meaning of the cross written by the Most Rev'd Stephen Cottrell (now Archbishop of York). We will be encouraging church members to come together to reflect and pray using this resource and so have ordered 10 printed copies of 'I Thirst' at \$18.00 each, but the book is also available in electronic form from various sources (Kindle etc) for about \$13. The consensus was that we ought to continue to acknowledge traditional custodians but to seek to improve how we do it. In light of this the Executive resolved that, in both Sunday services, beginning on Sunday 19th February, we will trial a more succinct statement to be used at the time of 'The Peace' (in the Second Order Service). We will utilise the Prayer Book's alternative greeting 'Christ has reconciled us to God in one body through the cross,' and pick up the theme of reconciliation in our acknowledgement of the traditional custodians.
