## Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. (Romans 5:1-11)

The word "justified" comes straight from the courtroom where the declaration "not guilty" or "pardoned" sets a person free from an impending sentence of punishment. It occurs frequently in the first part of Romans. When we are justified, we receive the divine gift of righteousness through faith in Christ. Instead of being considered on the "wrong side" of God, we are now pardoned, and the threat of condemnation goes away. To be justified means more than to be declared not guilty, it means that the relationship has been set right....we are at peace with God. "This is not the kind of peace we talk about when we talk about peace of mind, although it might lead to that. Our peace with God is a real condition in which the estrangement caused by sin has been removed. We are now in right relationship, at peace, with God. (Romans 5:8-10)

We have this peace because Jesus made it for us, justifying us and redeeming us. When we trust in what Christ has done for us and we trust him to carry us across the divide and into God's presence we have full "access to this grace in which we stand." (Romans 5:2) Through Jesus' death on the cross we have been brought into a state of peace with God and have been granted access to him, a relationship with him and his grace, love and compassion. We are in God's home because Jesus has made it possible for us to enter the place of righteousness, eternal life, and salvation by grace. And therefore of course we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God.

Acknowledgement of Country. At its meeting on Saturday, 20th May, the Parish Council had a constructive discussion about the use of the Acknowledgement of Country. Differing views were expressed by members of the Council and this no doubt, reflects the range of views in the congregation. As a way forward the Council proposed that we should try a form of acknowledgement that recognises the Kaurna people as the traditional custodians of the land but does not create disquiet by trying to say too much. We resolved to draft a form of words for this and to trial having this said by the service leader prior to the start of the service. Please feel free to offer some feedback to Rev'd Don or the wardens. Draft wording ... "We acknowledge the Kaurna people as the traditional custodians of the lands on which we meet. We recognise their deep feelings of attachment to country, and we respect their ongoing spiritual connection to the land."

**Kneelers!** This morning and for the next few weeks, on a trial basis, we will not use the tapestry kneelers normally placed at the gap in the communion rails. Those who prefer to kneel for Communion can continue to use the Communion rail and kneelers, those who prefer to stand might use the area without kneelers. We will review this in a few weeks. We have also had a possible trip hazard advised regarding the vinyl covered wooden kneelers in the pews. The concern is that, with our ageing congregation, these kneelers may cause a fall. The WHS Advisory Group is considering how best to respond to this and would appreciate your feedback.
