HE ASCENDED INTO HEAVEN ...

We repeat these words each Sunday when we affirm our faith by reciting the words of the Nicene Creed. But what is their significance?

St Luke's account of the Ascension in Acts 1.6 – 11 is sparse, to say the least and, for us, these verses may raise as many questions as they answer. For St Luke's original readers, however, they would have been charged with meaning. They would have recognised, firstly, that this is a 'succession narrative' – Jesus is handing over responsibility for the mission of the Kingdom to his followers. Christ's victory over sin and death - won through the cross and affirmed by the Resurrection – is complete, and now his Ascension heralds that part of God's plan in which the church is to bring the message of the Gospel 'to the ends of the earth.' (Acts 1.8)

The Ascension opens the way for Pentecost (which we celebrate next Sunday) and the empowering of the church for mission through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The original readers would also have recognised that the cloud that enveloped Jesus, as he leaves the apostles, signified that this Jesus, who was crucified and is risen, has been exalted by God and must direct the church from 'the heavenly realms' (Ephesians 1.20-23) until his return in glory. (Acts 1.11)

Amalgamation of St Luke's Modbury and St Mark's Golden Grove

As announced last Sunday, Diocesan Council has approved the registration of the new Parish of Modbury and Golden Grove (comprising the congregations of St Luke's, Modbury and St Mark's, Golden Grove). In the next few weeks, we will be giving notice of a joint meeting of the congregations, and sometime after that the Archbishop has indicated he will appoint the Rev'd Jo Smith as locum tenens for the new Parish. Once those steps are in place the new Parish will be registered and an initial Vestry meeting will be held to elect the Parish Council and Nomination Committee. We will keep you informed as these aspects of the process unfold.

The Work Health and Safety Advisory Group met last Wednesday and discussed:

- Improving the lighting at the base of the stairwell: Quotes being obtained
- Installation of a child safe gate and fence at the top of the stairs. Safe Work SA advice obtained advised use of pool type fencing. Quotes being obtained.
- Installation of a handrail along path to Op-Shop. Preparatory and design work has been completed.
- Items stored in the stairwell (other than 2 fans) have been disposed of; rubbish cleaned out, area swept. Action complete.
- Sanctuary steps and kneelers: could be a trip hazard especially for those with impaired mobility. Consultation with key people is taking place, some solutions proposed. In progress.
- Working at Heights: A Draft Policy has been developed and circulated.
- Regular WHS site inspections: A draft program has been developed.
- Purchase of AED (Defibrillator): Waiting on suitable First Aid training prior to purchase.
