All Saints Day and the Communion of the Saints

Today we celebrate All Saints Day. It's an opportunity to remember the 'ordinary saints' who, in some way, have shared our lives and encouraged our faith. Perhaps they helped us to our earliest decision to follow Jesus, perhaps they offered Christlike support in the difficult times of life, or perhaps they were simply, but significantly, our companions on the Christian journey - companions whom we loved and from whom we have been parted by death. As we remember their love and commitment to us, and as we give thanks to God for them, we're encouraged to follow their example, to persevere in living for Christ, and challenged to show a similar love and commitment to those whom God brings into the orbit of our own lives.

All Saints Day also speaks to us of the Communion of Saints – the communion that we have through Christ with all who have gone before us in the faith. This reminds us that, while death does bring a very real separation from those whom we loved, it does not have the final word. The good news of the Gospel is that Christ has conquered death and risen triumphant over it, and has called to himself a new community – the communion of saints – who, through faith in him, share his victory over sin and death. So, while we grieve, Christians do not grieve in the same way as those who have no faith, because we look forward to a resurrection to a renewed life with God and with those brothers and sisters in Christ who have gone before us, a life in which (as St John puts it):

God himself will be with them; he will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain any more, for the former things have passed away." (Rev 21.3-4)

The funeral of Reverend Reginald (Reg) Wynne will be held on Monday, 6th November, at St Luke's at 10.00 am, to be followed by a graveside committal and burial at Enfield Memorial Park at 11.45 am. Refreshments will be served in the Limestone Room at Enfield following the service.
