IN MY FATHER'S HOUSE, THERE ARE MANY DWELLING PLACES.

It isn't surprising that this text is so often used at funerals. There is comfort in our visions of the destination. The great house where there is a room for us, the vision of our loved ones being welcomed into eternity is something to hold onto in the midst of crisis and grief. Yet, as Jesus speaks over the Last Supper to his disciples about the dwelling place of God with many rooms, I don't think he wants us to focus on the destination and start imagining what it will be like. He wants us to focus on the way. And the way to get there is not to imagine the destination... But rather through the One who is the Way, the One who shows us the Father, the One who will face separation and isolation, who will go over the brink of sin and death... this One...

This Christ is our Way. This Christ our Truth.

This Christ is our Life.

This One is where we are going, this One brings us into God's way.

And as we wonder what is next for us and when we might get to our imagined destination, Jesus reminds us that the place that Jesus has always been going to has been to us. Meeting us in the Word and showing us the Father.

Welcoming us into the dwelling place of God in the waters of baptism.

Showing us the way at the table of the Lord, and transforming us into the Body of Christ. And as the Body of Christ we have always been going to the same place... always to New Life in God. And how do we get here, what is our way? Today Jesus reminds us again, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life.

At the Special Vestry meetings for St. Luke's and St. Mark's the proposal that a new amalgamated parish called The Anglican Parish of Modbury and Golden Grove was passed unanimously.
