Beauty, Permanence and Hope

‘Some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God.’ One might imagine that these, seemingly innocuous, remarks which open our gospel reading from Luke 21 could only draw an enthusiastic, affirming response. After all, the temple in Jerusalem in the time of Jesus *was very impressive*. To begin with it was massive – about 400 metres by 500 metres overall and the beautiful stones of which St Luke writes probably refer to the huge blocks of marble used in its construction. Gates and doors were plated in silver and gold. The Jewish historian Josephus wrote that it shone in the sun like a ‘snow clad mountain’. Jesus, however, uses that apparently innocuous opening remark as a teaching opportunity. Even something as magnificent and as apparently permanent as the temple can be torn down – and will be torn down. What does that say to us about those things which, perhaps without really thinking about it, we believe provide us with permanence and hope?

Report from the Joint Working Party. The Joint Working Party:

- Has received advice from Bishop Denise and the Archbishop regarding the parish amalgamation and the St Luke's nomination process which is that a decision regarding the amalgamation has to be made first, then the nomination process can be undertaken either for the new parish or for St Luke's.
- Will make a formal request through Bishop Denise that a financial health check of each parish be completed by Diocesan Office.
- Is in the process of developing a draft budget for an amalgamated parish.
- Is working to clarify the options for amalgamation available to us and will hopefully be able to report on this by 20 November.
- **Recommends:** That the JWP continues to meet to finalise the items reported on and continue to work on other items in accordance with its Terms of Reference.
