# Luke 13.22-35: Two forms of avoidance

In our passage today Jesus encounters two forms of avoidance. One is at a personal level and involves a passive form of avoidance. How much easier it is to ask speculative theological questions (Sir, will only a few be saved?) than to allow oneself to be confronted by the demands of the kingdom. It's a form of passive avoidance which is also common today. Jesus is not distracted; he takes this theoretical question and makes it personal. The question "Will the saved be few?" becomes, "Will the saved be you?"

The second form of avoidance is more active – it's the avoidance generated by forces set against the work of God's kingdom (and hence the mission of Jesus) and expressed through groups that wield power in the culture of the day. In our passage these cultural powers are represented by Herod, the Pharisees and the power of the mob in Jerusalem. Each in their own way seeks actively to subvert the mission of Jesus. Again, Jesus is not distracted. He has 'set his face toward Jerusalem' (Luke 9.51) and now he emphasises that he will fulfill his mission and do so in his time and his way. That way leads to Jerusalem and the apparent victory of these power groups when Jesus is crucified. But that isn't the end of the story! The resurrection of Jesus demonstrates that the cross is actually the defeat of sin and death and, ultimately, the defeat of those cultural powers that oppose God's mission. And, despite opposition, that mission continues.

Annual Vestry Meeting. The Annual Vestry Meeting of the Parish of Modbury and Golden Grove will be held at St Luke's at 11am today. Anyone who has attained the age of 18 years, who has received Holy Communion in the parish no less than three times during the last twelve months, and who can affirm that they are not members of any other church, may vote at the vestry meeting. At this meeting reports will be received from the Parish Priest and Wardens, the Treasurer and various other groups and teams within the parish. Importantly, at this meeting we will need to elect a People's Warden, Parish Councillors, Synod Representatives and members of the Nominations Committee. There are sheets at the rear of the church where you can nominate for one of these roles. Please note that you will also need someone to second your nomination. Reports will be available at the back of the church.

Our "Come as you are" Womens fellowship who meet on the first Friday of every month in our church hall, had such a fun morning in March. If you have not been before we encourage you to come on Friday, 4th April, 10-12 noon. Our speaker will be Linda Fisk, CEO and co-founder of "Seeds of Affinity: Pathways for Women. Along with her co-founder, they will talk to us about their 19 years of supporting women entrenched within the Criminal Justice system. Following this there will be a "Trading Table" where you can support the organisation by purchasing some special things. **Mothering Sunday.** In the English Church, in which the Anglican Church has its historic foundations, the fourth Sunday of Lent is observed as Mothering Sunday, a day when people would visit their Mother Church, the main church or cathedral of the area. This visit would become an occasion for family reunions as children, especially those working away from home would return to see and honour their mothers. At St Luke's we will be marking this tradition in the service next week.
