IN OUR CHURCH

My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. (Jesus in his farewell conversations, John 10.27 – 28)

I grew up among England's green and pleasant hills and on the few occasions that I came across shepherds, they seemed to be gentle and benign sort of folk whose main task was to move their sheep between pastures and protect them from extremes of the weather. That much they had in common with the shepherds of Palestine during and before the time of Jesus. In contrast to the shepherds I knew, however, Palestinian shepherds also had to deal with threats from wild beasts and robbers and, consequently, they developed a reputation for a fierce and possessive toughness. You didn't mess lightly with shepherds! In the quote above, from our Gospel reading, Jesus, the good shepherd (see John 10.11) tells his fearful disciples, that as far as his flock is concerned, 'No one shall snatch them out of my hand.' Whatever the circumstances of life, if we're held by Jesus, we need not fear.
