IN OUR CHURCH

Discipleship means teaching as Jesus taught

Our Gospel passage today (Matthew 28.18-20) is presented to us as the 'Final Command' of Jesus to "the eleven," after his resurrection and just prior to his ascension. Early followers of Jesus, reading these words would have attached significant importance to them, and so should we.

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Our Vision Statement.

St Luke's will be an open community of faith which engages with the community and inspires and encourages people to know Jesus Christ.

We should notice the priority given, in this final command, to ‘making disciples’. People, of course, come to faith in Jesus in many different ways, and churches need to be thinking constantly about how best to help people in their communities to come to know and trust Jesus. The overall aim, however, must always be to bring people to that point where they acknowledge Jesus as their Lord and Saviour, and accept baptism as being born again into the Church, God’s new community. But it doesn’t stop there. In our passage, Jesus goes on to emphasise the importance of teaching these new disciples ‘all I have commanded.’ Churches that are seeking to be obedient to this final command will not only emphasise the need to bring people to faith, they will also stress the need to develop that faith by faithfully teaching as Jesus taught.
