### Favourite Psalms (2): Psalm 23

Psalm 23 is perhaps one of the best-known parts of the Bible, probably because it speaks so powerfully into the reality of our lives. The Psalm celebrates the good times we experience in our lives, the green pastures, and quiet waters of life, but it also recognises the reality of the dark valleys of life, and indeed that darkest of valleys, the valley of the shadow of death. The Psalm urges us to recognise that the good times of our lives are blessings given by God, and it also reminds us that, in difficult times, even those dark times when death casts its pall of grief or fear over our lives, God does not abandon those who trust in him. Christians are prompted to remember the words of Jesus, the Good Shepherd: ‘I am the resurrection and the life, those who believe in me, though they die, yet shall they live and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die!’ (John 11.25-26)

**Resuming Holy Communion.** With the resumption of sharing both bread and wine at Holy Communion, the Parish Council has decided that, as with the choice whether or not to wear a mask, so the choice whether or not to use the traditional shared cup, should rest with the individual parishioner. Your decision will depend on your personal risk profile and your assessment of the risk in using the shared cup.

As an alternative to the shared cup we are also providing for the wine of Communion to be taken in individual glasses. As a third alternative, if you wish to, you can continue to receive Communion in one kind only – that is, simply to take the bread of Communion and then leave the Communion rail.

Please come forward for Communion in the normal way. The celebrant will bring the bread to you and will be followed by one of the lay assistants with the tray of individual glasses. If you wish to use that option please take a glass and drink the wine as the words of administration are said. When you leave the communion rail please turn to your right or left, depending on which side of the church you're on, and place the used glass in the basket placed for that purpose. If you wish to use the shared cup please refuse the individual glass and wait until the second lay assistant comes to you with the chalice.

The used glasses will be rinsed in a clean bucket of clean water and then washed using hot soapy water. Any wine remaining in the shared cup or in the individual glasses, will be poured onto the garden – which is an accepted practice.
