Luke 8. 26-39

Gospel stories of demon possession are difficult because we don't experience demons as described in the Bible. However, all the "demons" Jesus confronts have three things in common: they cause self-destructive behavior in the victim, the victim feels trapped in that condition, and they separate the victim from normal living in the family circle. Sound familiar? Don't many of us suffer from the same kind of snares and burdens? If we define "demons" as those forces which have captured us and prevented us from becoming what God intends us to be, we are as surrounded by — yes, possessed by — as many demons as those whom Jesus encountered. Our demons can be of many kinds: mental illnesses, schizophrenia, paranoia, addictions, obsessions, destructive habits, and so on. Note the similarities between this demon-possessed man and the demons that possess us. He was totally cut off from family and society. He didn't live as people, but "in the tombs," probably in caves that were used as burying places. He was also "driven by the demon into the wilds." In other words, he was already in a "living death," separated from normal people and normal living. The point of this story, as well as all the demon-healing stories in the Gospels is that the power of God can cast out demons. The seventy persons sent out by Jesus soon afterward came back and reported, no doubt with astonishment, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" (Luke 10:17)
