Martin Luther : A Reforming Saint.

Martin Luther was a German priest, theologian, author and professor. Luther was born on the 10th of November 1483 in Eisleben, in the county of Mansfeld, Holy Roman Empire and died on the 18th of February 1546 at the age of 62. A former Augustinian friar, Luther is best known as the seminal figure in the Protestant Reformation leading to his namesake of Lutheranism which later saw the creation of the Lutheran Church. His most well-known piece of work would be his ninety-five thesis that he famously nailed to the church door at Wittenburg, protesting against distortions of church teaching that were current at the time, most controversially the selling of indulgences to the family members of those who had passed away, as a means (according to the purveyors of these false teachings) of releasing their loved ones from purgatory.

Our Vision Statement. St. Luke's will be an open community of faith which engages with the community and inspires and encourages people to know Jesus Christ.

Holy Communion at St Luke's. With the resumption of sharing both bread and wine at Holy Communion the choice whether or not to use the traditional shared cup rests with you. Your decision will depend on your personal risk profile and your assessment of the risk in using the shared cup. As an alternative to the shared cup we are also providing for the wine of Communion to be taken in individual glasses.

As a third alternative, if you wish to, you can continue to receive Communion in one kind only – that is, simply to take the bread of Communion and then leave the Communion rail. Please come forward for Communion in the normal way. The celebrant will bring the bread to you and will be followed by one of the lay assistants with the tray of individual glasses. If you wish to use that option, please take a glass and drink the wine as the words of administration are said. When you leave the communion rail please turn to your right or left, depending on which side of the church you're on, and place the used glass in the basket placed for that purpose. If you wish to use the shared cup, please refuse the individual glass and wait until the second lay assistant comes to you with the chalice.

Flowers for Sundays. If you would like to make a donation for someone you have loved or lost, please add your name to the list on the noticeboard in the Balcony Room and give the money to Toni.

Lectionary. Anyone requiring a lectionary for 2023 (Year A) please put your name on the list in the Balcony Room before 18th November. Cost will be \$15.
